
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

May God bless you all.





The Church and the Holv Ourbana are one of the most important things in Christanity. We can't just come up to the Church, we have to actively participate in the Holv Qurbana along with the Priest and Deacons. First of all. we should respond when necessary, this could be just saying "Amen" or "Kurielaison" to bowing your head when the prayer for all to bow heads is recited.

Personally, I carry my Living Sacrifice (Ourbana Kramam), it helps me follow along with the prayers and hymns. Along with responding, singing hymns and praying, you should try your level best to intake Holy Qurbana (Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me, and I in them. {John 6:56}). We must also learn and understand the Evangelion recited the bv Priest during the Holy Qurbana

Our church believes in freedom. freedom assigned to man by God. In our prayers through Holy Confession, the freedom of God to man is described as the covenant. the constitution given by God to man. Romans 2:15," the requirements of the law are written on their hearts. their consciences also bearing witness. and their thoughts sometimes accusing them and at other times even defending them."

For most religious traditions, religious pluralism is essentially based on a non-literal view of one's religious tradition, hence allowing respect to be endangered between traditions, especially on core principles rather than marginal issues.

It is perhaps summarized as an attitude that rejects focus on immaterial differences and gives respect to beliefs held in common.



ACT 4:12 SAYS, "SALVATION IS FOUND IN NO ONE ELSE, FOR THERE IS NO OTHER NAME UNDER HEAVEN GIVEN TO MANKIND BY WHICH WE MUST BE SAVED."



It is alleged that because we live in a pluralistic society, we have no moral right to try to change a person's beliefs. Rather, we should pursue dialogues in a multi-faith context on the assumption that all beliefs are equally valid.

We live in a highly pluralistic society, which encourages the virtue of religious harmony and tolerance. On the other side, we receive the Great Commandment from Christ to "go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you" Matthew 28:19-20

To deal meaningfully with the complex issue, we must understand the nature of Christian witness in the context of today's society. Of his nosological principle, Paul wrote, "To those under the law I became as one under that I might win those under the law. To those outside the law, I became as one outside that I might win those outside the law" (1 Cor. 9:20-21).

So, what do the Christians have to offer to a pluralistic society? Following Paul, we should answer pluralistic portrayals of Christ and context-sensitive knowledge of our pluralistic society.

In John 1:29 John The Baptist exclaims, "Look, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!" John was using priestly vocabularies, yet the meaning extends beyond the priestly context. True Christian witness does believe in grand biblical story but never oppressive. In this regard, Christians need not fear the accusation of being threats to religious harmony. God's love for the world is greater than our fear. As the word of God says, "There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear." JEFE ESTVAL DEPERMENT

Originally, the Sacrament of Matrimony was founded in the garden of Eden, the constituents of the union in marriage are love and faithfulness.

The Orthodox Church marriage is neither a treaty nor an agreement between a man and it is woman. а а Sacrament. God commands that man shall not separate what God has joined, thus the sacramental nature is evident from this.

There are two parts to the sacrament of marriage, namely: 1. Liturgy of Blessing the Rings 2. Liturgy of Blessing with the Crowns In Orthodox Church normally only one marriage is permitted. However, if a partner dies, remarriage is permitted but the blessing of the crowns will not be repeated as it can be administered only once. There is also a special liturgy created

for second marriage which has a special emphasis on repentance.

Marriage is a sacrament and requires preparation and a spiritual environment. All forms of luxury and ostentation shall be avoided in the details of the sacrament of marriage.



Holy Qurbana was established by Jesus Christ during the Last Supper, that is the Feast of Passover, in Mark's house. The prayers in our Holy Qurbana have the background of deep theological insights used from ancient times and they contain the unadulterated faith of the Church. There are separate prayers to be said by the Priest, the Altar Assistants, and the congregation, thus ensuring the participation of the entire Church in the Sacrament.

By participating in the Holy Qurbana, we become participants in the salvific history and proclaim the fundamental elements of the Church. The following factors are important facets in this proclamation:

a. The Holy Qurbana is the participation in the worship of the Holy Trinity

b. The Holy Qurbana gives forgiveness of sins

c. Holy Qurbana is a sacrifice without blood

d. Through the Holy Qurbana, we participate in the salvific activities of our Lord

e. In the Holy Qurbana, all creation, the heavenly beings and the earthly ones all come together

The Holy Qurbana we celebrate today is mainly divided into three parts, namely:

1. The Order of Thooyobo

2. The Public Celebration of the Holy Eucharist

3. Anaphora






VOICES OF EXPERIENCE



Late H.G Dr. Geevarghese Mar Osthathios

Geevarghese Mar Osthathios Metropolitan (Sabharathnam) of the Malankara Orthodox Church is widely known in India and abroad as a prophet of social justice and as a propagator of the Universal Religion of Love. He founded St Paul's Ashram and Children Home. He is the founder of Mission Training Centre, Mavelikara which gives the training to lay missionaries of love and evangelism. He also started more than 40 humanitarian institutions, movements, and projects all over India for poor people, HIV-positive patients, and their children, cancer patients, leprosy patients, and their children, and orphan, old age homes for men and women.

He has written about 59 books of which 13 are in English. He preached that it is a sin to be rich in a poor society and about One Religion of Love. He has participated in so many national and international conferences as a leader, preacher, and resource person. BETHANY BEYOND IORDAN In 1996, this settlement site on the east bank of the Jordan River was rediscovered and verified as the place where John the Baptist lived and performed baptisms (John 1:28). Adding to the sacred significance, lesus was baptized by John (Matthew 3:13-17) and began his ministry by enlisting his first disciples – Simon, Peter, Andrew, Philip, and Nathaniel there. This is the area where also scripture says that the prophet Elijah ascended into heaven on a chariot of fire (2 Kings 2).



DEAD SEA

The Dead Sea is mentioned in the prophecy of the Seer Ezekiel. The Book of Ezekiel recalls how he foresaw a time when the Dead Sea would be transformed from saline waters that cannot host life into freshwaters teeming with sea life. He prophesized that "Swarms of living creatures will live wherever the river flows".

MOUNT NEBO

Mount Nebo is a high, windy outcrop in Jordan that overlooks the Dead Sea and much of the Holy Land. This was Moses' last stop on the Exodus from Egypt. He could see the Holy Land of Canaan - on a clear day you can see Jericho and Jerusalem. He died on Mount Nebo. It's also believed that the prophet Jeremiah hid the Arc of the Covenant in a cave on Mount Nebo, but that has never been found either.
